Fingal community plants trees in honour of Her Majesty, The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

The Fingal community and Break O'Day Council planted four oak trees in honour of Her Majesty, The Queen's Platinum Jubilee on Friday 16 December 2022.

Students, community members and dignitaries gathered at 4pm at the Fingal Recreation Ground, the same site where trees were planted for Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee back in 1897.

Reenacting the Diamond Jubilee planting 125 years ago, four local school children planted some young new oaks to add to the surviving old ones planted by school students in 1897.

Brian Mitchell MP, Federal Member for Lyons unveiled a Platinum Jubilee commemorative plaque at the site.

Mayor Mick Tucker said the community and Fingal Neighbourhood House had arranged an amazing event that not just commemorated Her Majesty the Queen but also recognized Fingal's history.

"The Fingal community are very proud of their history and this was a wonderful

day for the community to show case this.

"I'm really pleased Council was able to support them with our Break O'Day Communities Queen's Jubilee Trees project.

"There was a history display provided by the Fingal Valley Neighbourhood House History Society which I really enjoyed exploring and I am sure everyone there did too, "Mayor Mick Tucker said.

After the trees were planted, attendees enjoyed a BBQ, market stalls and kids activities organised by the Fingal Neighbourhood House and local community.

The Break O'Day Council's Break O'Day Communities Queen's Jubilee Trees project received funding from the Australian Government's Planting Trees for The Queen's Jubilee Program. The project is providing trees for six other townships in Break O'Day municipality to honour the Queen's Jubilee in 2022.

Look out for nesting Shore birds

Did you know half the remaining eastern hooded plover population call Tasmania home? What's more, approximately 20% of these can be found on our northeastern beaches!

Hooded plovers are small, threatened shorebirds. They live on beaches and rely on these areas to feed and nest. With summer here, hooded plovers are now in their breeding season. Hooded plovers lay their tiny, speckled eggs in a shallow scrape in the sand above the high-tide mark, and while their eggs are well camouflaged from predators, they are also difficult to see making them easy to step on.

The fairy tern is another rare and threatened bird with little more than 100

breeding pairs visiting Tasmania. About 70 pairs are nesting near St Helens this year.

There are many factors that makes survival hard enough for these threatened and vulnerable birds, but there is something we can do.

As you walk on the beach this summer, be mindful of where you tread, keep to the wet sand, and adhere to dog onleash and exclusion zones. If you see a roped-off area, this means a nest has been identified - please be a good egg and give it a wide berth.

St Marys Pass and Elephant Pass update

St Marys Pass is now open. A big thanks to the contractors and the State Government for making the Pass works a priority.

Council's position is that we would like to see the State Government consider all alternate route options to the East Coast that will not bypass our townships.

The State Government has announced that they will close the Elephant Pass on Tuesday 3 January 2023 to conduct repairs. Local Access will still be provided. This work is expected to be complete in early February 2023.

Council Works Reports

- Work has started on a new footpath in Young Street, St Helens. The path will create a link between Medea Cove Esplanade and Tully Street.
- Grading is occurring in the Ansons Bay area including Eddystone Point Road, Policemans Point Road and Ansons Bay Road.
- Road reconstruction/digouts are being done to fix pavement failures at Scamander and St Marys caused by the severe weather events.
- Crews are working tirelessly to manage grass cutting throughout the municipality. They are being hampered by the occasional wet day here and there.
- Roadside slashing is underway at St Marys and Fingal. Then moving to Upper Scamander Road and the St Helens area.
- Our road resealing program will commence in mid January with prep works and resealing starting in late January.

Council has heard story after story of people who have found employment in our area, or are looking to move their family here but are unable to find suitable housing.

This is really bad news for our community because it means local businesses are struggling to find and keep employees, potential service providers are unable to establish and it means our community cannot grow. Simply put, we desperately need rental housing now to support seasonal workers, families, young people and anyone who can't afford to purchase a home right now.

This is where you come in... If you have a secondary house or holiday home that you're not using all the time, we would love to chat to you about exploring ways you could support our community.

You may be open to renting a room to a seasonal worker, renting your house over winter while you don't use it, or maybe you're not using the shack the way you used to and it could better serve you as generating income as a long term rental for a while or, you may want to change from short-term to long-term rental to give you a consistent cash flow while interest rates are high.
