Throughout the evening there will be a barbecue with the evening ending with a silent disco, and the opportunity to just hang around the fire pit.

There will be a small entry fee and any money raised at the event will be donated to Love Your Sister.

Samuel will also be visiting the St Helens District High School from 2pm where he will be talking about his latest project, the F*&%# Cancer Community Bank.

Samuel Johnson became a household name when he decided to ride a unicycle around Australia to raise funds for cancer, inspired by his sister, Connie's personal battle with the disease.

Sadly Connie lost her fight with the disease 12 months ago but her memory lives on through Samuel's dedication to the cause and the people whose lives were touched by the bond between the siblings.

Just after Connie passed away, Sam announced he had fulfilled his promise to his late sister, raising \$10 million towards cancer research, and now Samuel is aiming to raise \$10million more. All are welcome to attend and be a part of this amazing community event.

St Helens Mountain Bike Trails to open with Emergency two day celebration - 22-23 November

It's officially official; the St Helens Mountain Bike Trails will open on Friday 22 November with a huge event following on Saturday 23 November.

"With so much to celebrate we just had to stretch the opening over two days," Mayor Mick Tucker said.

"We are just so excited to be able to finally share this project with everyone and when I say we, I mean the whole community."

The Friday will focus on dignitaries and feature official ribbon cutting ceremonies at Swimcart Beach at 11:30am followed by a ribbon cutting ceremony at the Trailhead off Flagstaff Rd, St Helens at 12:30pm.

Riders are welcome to come and ride the trails from 9am.

Following on from the official ceremonies, the Break O'Day Council is working with the business community to put together some activities for community members who may be Friday evening, so stay tuned.

On the Saturday, the whole township of St Helens will come alive with the Mountains to the Sea Trail-fest which will feature three hubs of activity around the town including; A Family Hub featuring MTB Skills and coaching, a MTB Demo Hub featuring an MTB stunt rider and MTB pop-up stalls as well as a Chillax Hub, featuring live music... and we are still working on more.

Weed of the month- Boneseed



Boneseed is a declared weed in Tasmania as well as being a Weed of National Significance. It is considered one of the worst and most invasive weeds in Australia due to its ability to establish itself anywhere and its potential to spread. They can produce up to 50,000 seeds per year making treatment of an area with mature plants a several year project.

In the state Weed Management Act, landowners have a responsibility to remove and eradicate boneseed from their property. Due to their shallow root system, they are easily hand pulled or carefully spot sprayed with a registered herbicide. Plants can be piled ensuring the roots are not in contact with the ground. If seeds are present, they can be cut off, bagged and burnt.

Boneseed is now flowering and easy to identify, this is the perfect time to treat and remove, remembering follow up in the next year or two is essential. For more information please visit: http://dpipwe.tas.gov.au/invasive-species/weeds/weeds-index/declared-weeds-index/boneseed
