REMEMBRANCE GARDEN

The significance of this remembrance garden is to provide a focused area where family and visitors can come to reflect on the life of a deceased loved one.

When a loved one is cremated, their ashes can either be scattered at their favorite place, scattered amongst the garden, or placed into the columbarium feature walls.

Essentially, the garden offers a quite contemplation space embraced by hedging and decorative planting to provide an atmosphere of security and comfort.

NUMBER LEGEND

- Adjoining carpark and compacted gravel access road.
- 2 Eight 'Ornamental Pear' trees bring additional colour, interest and formality to the garden.
- 3 Timber slat seat with metal legs placed outside the remembrance garden to allow visitors a place to sit outside the garden.
- 4 Ornate metal entry gate and fence.
- 5 'Maiden Hair' tree as a central feature to the garden.
- 6 Fourteen granite columns within the central garden allows name plaques for the deceased who have had their ashes scattered within the central garden.
- Y Seven 'Japanese Maple' trees placed around the center of the garden to provide shade over the seating areas and to add seasonal interest to the garden.
- 1.6m High clipped hedge to enclose the garden providing privacy to those remembering loved ones.
- 1.6m High columbarium wall consisting of black brick with white mortar allowing ash canister and plaque placements. Charcoal coloured concrete pavement to the front of the walls highlight the reflection zones.
- 10 Timber slat seats with metal legs placed within the central garden to allow adequate space to sit under the shade and reflect on a loved one's placement within the columbariums.
- 11 Low singular species groundcover within the central part of the garden.
- 12 Low colourful groundcovers and bulbs at the foot of the perimeter hedge to provide colour and seasonal change to the garden.
- 13 Heavy duty wire netting fence to surround the hedge to keep out wallabies and rabbits.
- 14 Existing monumental graves.
- 15 Australian native shade tree adjoining the new car park.
